Seeking a Full-time Associate Pastor

Ebenezer Baptist Church, a church of the Baptist General Conference of Canada is seeking a full-time associate pastor in Wetaskiwin, AB., Canada. Ebenezer is a church that bridges rural and urban in a small city 50 minutes south of Alberta's capital, Edmonton. The church is a warm and welcoming body of believers that is committed to community and is growing. Wetaskiwin is located 9 km from one of the largest Aboriginal-First Nation reserves in Canada. This is called Maskwacis which in Cree means "Bear Hills". Maskwacis is home to another 15,000 people making up 4 distinct nations.

Historically Wetaskiwin has serviced a large surrounding agricultural base but this has also come to include a multi-faceted community of manufacturing, light industry, warehousing and other small business. The city has also become a bedroom community for Edmonton and several other small cities that are within a half hour drive away (the city is also about the same distance from the Edmonton International Airport). Wetaskiwin is home to a new aquatic/fitness center (within last 10 years), and a world class provincial museum that chronicles the technological development of Alberta.

Interested candidates would possess traditional theological and doctrinal positions holding to biblical inerrancy and authority and would have a strong commitment to prayer and ministry of the Word (Acts 6:4).

The associate pastor's portfolio would include ministry to young families, seniors, leading a team-based approach to youth ministry and assisting the lead pastor in all pastoral responsibilities as gifted and assigned.
